- 2. Don't make or teach assumptions.
- Communication is two or more individuals sharing and understanding an idea.
- 4. Horses and humans have mutual responsibilities:
- Humans:
 - Act like a partner, not a predator.
 - Have an independent seat and feet.
 - Think like a horse.
 - Use the natural power of focus.
- Horses:
 - Act like a partner, not a prey animal.
 - Maintain gait.
 - Maintain direction.
 - Look where you're going.
- 5. The attitude of justice is effective.
- 6. Body language is universal.
- 7. Horses teach humans and humans teach horses.
- 8. Principles, purpose, and time are the tools of teaching.
